

A Verse to Think About: Luke 2:25-31 NIV

Now there was a man in Jerusalem called Simeon, who was righteous and devout. He was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not die before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. Moved by the Spirit, he went into the temple courts. When the parents brought in the child Jesus to do for him what the custom of the Law required, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying: "Sovereign Lord, as you have promised, you may now dismiss your servant in peace. For my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the sight of all nations:

Simeon had waited for the coming Messiah all his life, he was promised that he would not die before he saw the Lord's New Messiah. After he had a chance to hold the baby he said that the Lord could dismiss him in peace. Today as we light the 2nd candle let us rejoice in the peace that we have in Christ Jesus our Savior.
